NOMINATION FORM



Purpose:

The APWA WA Project of the Year Sustainability Award was established to promote excellence in the management, administration and implementation of sustainable goals and practices in the delivery of public works projects.

Eligibility:

Public works projects must be developed, owned, and maintained by public agencies. To be eligible for nomination, a project must have been "substantially completed" and available for public and/or agency use within two calendar years prior to nomination. If a project has multiple phases or segments, then "substantially completed" will be construed as that point when the final phase or segment is 90% completed and available for public and/or agency use. However, the project does **not** need to have achieved an formal sustainability rating.

Selection:

The Environment and Sustainability Committee reviews the nominations and selects the award winners with concurrence from the Chapter Board.

Criteria:

Criteria to be used in the selection process include:

1. **Leadership** – Demonstrate how the project was developed, delivered, and how sustainability goals were achieved through communication and collaboration. Describe how the project benefitted from a new way of thinking.
2. **Quality of Life** – Describe how the project impacted the local and regional community's health and wellbeing.
3. **Resource Allocation** – Showcase how the project team assessed material resources for infrastructure development and ongoing operations. Detail the projects adoption of sustainable measures to minimize resource consumption and promote resource efficiency.
4. **Natural World** – Provide examples of how the project reduced impacts on the natural world (i.e. habitats, species, and nonliving natural systems).
5. **Climate and Resilience** – Demonstrate how the project minimized construction and life cycle emissions that contribute to climate change. Describe how the team incorporated resiliency measures that are informed, resourceful, robust, redundant, flexible, integrated, and inclusive.
6. **Education and Outreach** – Showcase how the team emphasized public education and outreach related to the sustainable aspects of the project.

Nomination Process:

Nominations of projects can be made by the managing public agency.

Ceremony:

A designated representative of the public agency, contractor and consultant are each presented a plaque at the Project of the Year Ceremony held during the Thursday of Chapter Spring Conference every year. You do not need to be a conference attendee to attend the awards ceremony. The winner is also featured in APWA magazine PublicWORKS and on social media.
